Dear Disc'n Dudes hopeful,

It has come to our attention that you may be interested in becoming an official member



of the Disc'n Dudes of America. We are pleased you have shown an interest, but Disc'n Dudes of America is a very exclusive organization.

The first step in becoming a full member and enjoying all the benefits of membership is to obtain the DnD Green Card you will find enclosed. This Green Card, once activated, will entitle you to participate in some but not all of the Disc'n Dudes activities held throughout the year.

The second step to full membership is to participate in at least two rounds of golf with a full member in good standing. After the round you can ask the member if he will vouch for you and sign your green card.

Finally, after fulfilling these obligations, you may present your authorized green card and call for a vote to be accepted as full member at any DnD sanctioned activity (see enclosed schedule) where more than three full members are present. At that time, a secret ballot will be held with all members present voting yes or no.

If all members present vote yes to accept you, congratulations, you are now full member and can begin enjoying all the benefits of full membership. A new member packet will be sent to you in a few weeks and will include your membership card with your lifetime member number. In the meantime, hang on to your green card until you receive your new member card with lifetime member number.

BUT if you get any NO votes on the initial ballot, you will be given *one* opportunity to speak and convince the Dudes you are a worthy applicant. You may not ask any members why/if they voted to reject you. After your arguments, another secret vote will be taken. Again, if you get all yes votes, you are in. But, if you get any no votes in the second round of voting, you will be banned from participating in any future Disc'n Dudes activities for the remainder of the year and will be required to immediately forfeit your Green Card. Fortunately, all is not lost. You can obtain another Green Card next season if you can get a member in good standing to sponsor you again. I would suggest you think long and hard about the possible reasons you were not accepted.
